USE OF THE CAR PARKING FACILITY AT HARMANS CROSS

Reprinted below is an extract from a communication recently received by the Committee from the Clerk of Worth Matravers Parish Council.





"Further to the meeting of the Parish Council on the 7 February I have been tasked to contact the U3A in respect of their members regular usage of the HX Car Park The car park as you will be aware is run by the Parish Council and not the village hall yet it is clear that few if any of the U3A members who regularly use the hall make any donation let alone the £1 requested towards the quite large running costs of the car park.

May I seek your assistance in communicating to your members that if this continues there is a strong possibility especially with rental and the council tax revaluation coming in for 2017 -18 of the car park being closed to their and the communities who benefit in the future. The hall is a lovely warm local facility well run by its management committee and it would be a desperate shame if a local what I can describe as mean ness from users of the car park results in the car park closure".

This applies to the car parking facility across the road from the Village Hall which PU3A members frequently use when the Hall car park is full, not only on Meeting Points days but also by the

Your Committee asks that in future all users of the facility make a payment of the not unreasonable amount of £1 per vehicle which will help to ensure that we continue to have use of the car park.

It would be a great shame if the Parish Council was forced to either close the

car park completely, or, horror of horrors, ban PU3A members from using it!


Hopefully members will access the page to tell us of specimen plants that can be seen from path, roadway or 'over the garden fence'.

During our first full year, the Nordic Walking Group has gone from strength to strength. After a few early changes we have settled to 18 members of which only 22% are male! Nordic Walking is growing in popularity, as evidenced by a recent letter in one of the broad sheet newspapers which drew a favourable comparison with running (see below).

We hold two regular walks each month on the first and third Friday. Walks are organised, by members on a rotational basis,

in the Purbeck area. About 90 minutes in duration, walks are designed to enhance fitness within a friendly and sociable atmosphere. Walks are free.

In 2016, twenty three walks have been held with an average attendance of 7 members. To join the group, members must have undertaken formal training
