Singing For Pleasure

When John Almond's 'Singing for Pleasure' group came to an end, it was feared that the Purbeck Hills would no longer be alive with the sound of U3A music. But we are pleased to report that a new 'Singing for Pleasure' group has risen, phoenix-like, and is now up and running thanks to maestro Rod Brassington who stepped up to the keyboard last October. Thanks are also due to Roger Free, who played a big part in the

group's formation.

The choir – now 30 voices strong – meets fortnightly on a Wednesday afternoon at Carey Village Hall, tackling a variety of music: some unison singing; some three or four part 'rounds'; and more challenging numbers with more complicated harmonies. As with any U3A group, members have different expectations and abilities, and Rod strives to cater for all tastes.

Anyone who has watched the inspirational Gareth Malone on television will be aware of the many benefits – physical and emotional - of singing in a choir. Indeed, scientists have shown that not only does singing make you feel good, it's got health benefits too.





Done properly, the regular controlled breathing needed for singing helps you relax and, combined with the use of core muscles, can have the same effect as a yoga session! Oxygen levels in the blood increase, triggering the release of 'happy' hormones such as oxytocin, lowering stress levels and blood pressure with a positive impact on heart and lungs.

No wonder choral singing has been used as music therapy in hospitals, care homes and hospices for decades. There have even been suggestions that singing should be available 'on prescription'!

Like almost all singing groups, the sopranos and altos currently outnumber tenors and basses, so if there are any men out there who want to exercise their vocal cords – don't be shy! You will be given a warm welcome. You don't need to read music, and you don't need any previous experience.

Graeme is an ex-Winfrith Nuclear Physicist and Open University lecturer who has had a lifelong fascination with astronomy. We are fortunate that he is more than willing to share his enthusiasm.

Graeme has presented his astronomy course to numerous U3As and local science groups over the years, always to high acclaim.

The course is a series of 28 meetings/lectures/demonstrations spread over 3 academic terms. It is pitched to cater for participants with a wide range of background and experience.

Topics covered are far ranging and structured, for example, the history of astronomy from the dawn of civilization to the present day, including, interestingly, the personalities and political intrigues that influenced it. He covers the origins, formation and structure of our own planet and the solar system, followed by discussions of stars and galaxies. This leads on to a series of talks on Cosmology describing the structure, development and origins of our universe and finally speculative theories of the end scenario.

Meetings are much more than a formal lecture format. Graeme welcomes and encourages audience interaction, willingly going over difficult aspects when asked.

Membership Matters

It may be obvious, but good practice dictates that we inform members that their membership records are held on a computer. Furthermore, although Purbeck U3A's records do not fall within the scope of the Data Protection Act we do endeavour to hold members' information secure and observe the Act's principles.

Patrick Webb, our Treasurer, is required by HMRC to keep subscription information for a minimum of 7 years and I will keep member' records only for as long as they may be useful. To protect membership information still further the email addresses that are used to send out Broadcasts to you are held completely separately from the membership records.

I don't wish to be alarmist but despite those measures as well as your own and your Internet Service Provider's best security measures there is a strong likelihood that sooner or later you will receive unsolicited and unwanted emails. Most of these are probably harmless but unfortunately it's virtually impossible to tell the innocent from the malicious.

During January I received over 20 emails to my memsec@ email address that were scam emails. Three of them appeared to have come from members and simply said "greetings memsec" or similar and contained a link which I could have clicked on if I didn't know better.

The moral of this story is not to click on links or open attachments in emails from people you don't know and to be similarly cautious with links and attachments in emails from people or financial institutions you do know! – especially if they are unexpected or in some way unusual -- and don't be tempted to: "Click here if this has been sent to you in error".

Scam emails are a regular occurrence for me and I'm always on my guard, but I have to admire the skill and psychology that has gone into the creation of some of them which appear on the face of it to be completely authentic. I can understand why newcomers to emails will innocently do the wrong thing.

Lifts to Meeting Points

Might you be willing to give a lift to someone living in your area to Meeting Points? We have some members who no longer drive but would like to attend the talks.

If you volunteer, you would be put on a list of such helpers.

Anyone needing a lift would contact an intermediary and they would be put in contact with a possible driver.

You would be under no obligation to attend every meeting or to give a lift every time you do come.

If you feel able to help, please give your details to any member of the Committee or sign up at the next Meeting Points.

ICE (In Case of Emergency)

Do you have your contact details for your nearest and dearest entered under ICE on your mobile phone?

ICE is an initiative that enables first responders, such as paramedics, fire-fighters, police officers as well as hospital personnel to contact the next of kin of the owner of the mobile phone to obtain important medical or support information (the phone must be working).

The phone entry should be supplemented by written information (such as in a wallet card, U3A key ring). The initiative was conceived in 2004 by Bob Brotchie, a British paramedic. It encourages people to enter emergency contact numbers in their mobile address book under the name 'ICE'. A person can list multiple emergency contacts as 'ICE1' 'ICE2' etc. This initiative has taken off across Europe and Australia and now in North America.

• The Third Age Trust

The great majority of U3A organisations in the UK are supported by the Third Age Trust. It offers services and advice not just to Committee Members and Group Leaders but to individual members as well.

If you go to www.u3a.org.uk you can log in to the members' area and visit the Events page to view all current events organised by National Office.

The Trust also runs **Residential Summer Schools** where you can spend a few days in pleasant surroundings with like minded people doing some in depth study on anything from architecture to singing for pleasure.

This year the courses take place at the Royal Agricutural University Circumster from the 8th-11th August and 15th-18th August but places are filling up fast.

For Group Leaders or anyone who is just thinking about starting up a group, there is a subject adviser for just about any subject you can think of, whose contact details can be found on the National Office website and who are happy to give the benefit of their experience. There is also a Resource Centre where books, DVDs etc. are available to borrow.

Did you know there is a legal helpline provided by Arc Legal Assistance in partnership with Irwin Mitchell Solicitors available seven days a week to all U3A members at no charge? To access the legal helpline call 0344 770 1040 and quote U3A legal helpline.
