
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Singing for Pleasure

From the Editor...

Winter floods gone and rainfall amounts again becoming normal, we can look ahead with optimism. With approximately 19 inches of rainfall measured so far this year here in Ridge as I write (in early April), you will see that already we have had well over half our annual 30 inches in just over three months. Indeed on two days this year – 17th January and 7th February -I measured daily rainfall amounts of 1.15 and 1.22 inches respectively and the totals for January and February were 9.49" and 7.05", more than three times the norm. However March made up for it with 16 consecutive days with no measurable rain at all!

Having finished the weather report, on to the Summer line-up of U3A events starting with the AGM on Thursday 15th May which, as you will have seen elsewhere, has been given added interest this year by the appearance of the Dorset singing and comedy duo *Ball & Socket* – billed as "A varied and humorous musical afternoon of local and topical relevance by the much travelled local 'joint act'". I am told they are modelled on the well known duo from the past: Flanders & Swann of *The Hippopotamus, The Gnu* and *A Transport of Delight* fame. It should certainly be a good antidote to the formal nature of the AGM.



The committee is very much aware of the high price of postage, particularly with regard to the cost of membership renewals, and of the adverse effect it would have on subscription rates if we were to continue using the Royal Mail postal service. Those of you who have previously renewed your membership at Open Days will probably also be aware that the process there is far from satisfactory. For those and other reasons it has been decided that Membership Renewals will not in future be handled at Open Days.

In order to keep costs down for both U3A and our members we intend, where possible, to avoid sending items by post and instead handle renewals through Meeting Points or other U3A groups/activities where a committee member is present - or better still handle renewals completely

electronically. Further details regarding Subscription Renewals will be sent as an email Broadcast in May, but those without email are receiving a Renewal Form with this newsletter.

For those members with online banking it is a very simple matter to renew without even having to fill in a form simply make a bank transfer electronically of the appropriate amount and send an email to us as notification - in turn you will be emailed your new Membership Number. You won't even to have to carry a membership card as your Group Leader(s) will be advised directly of your membership number.

If you do not wish to pay by online banking, any committee member will be happy to receive your completed renewal form and remittance if handed to him/her in a sealed envelope. Some Group Leaders will also be able to collect your renewal forms in this manner.

All this will be explained in more detail in May when we shall start asking for your renewal subscriptions ... and I'm sure you'll be pleased to know that the annual subscription is being held at £16. It will help us enormously if you will please renew early and we hope it will benefit you too by not having to spend money on stamps.

The Singing for Pleasure group was initiated by Tony Capon around 11 years ago under the leadership of Geoff Sloper. The group started in St Mary's Church hall, Swanage with around 20 members,. When Geoff died early in 2005, the group was kept going by Jean Gibbs and Jenny Jones until the sessions finished in June. I then took over the group on a temporary basis until a permanent leader could be found.

In addition I started and led the Drama Group which, over a period of about three years, performed several pantomimes, plays and musicals for the U3A membership. This group eventually stopped due to the inability to recruit male actors, but it was great fun while it lasted!

As the singing group started to grow it moved into the Rectory classroom, adjacent to St Mary's Church where it continued until 2010 when the group numbers reached forty

members. So in January 2010 it moved to All Saints Church hall in Swanage. Due to the demand for places, I started another group in Sandford Community Hall, and ran both groups until June 2011. The Swanage group has since closed and, until now I continued to lead the Sandford Singing for Pleasure group which has 46 members. With great sadness, however, through my continuing and increasing health problems, I feel that I can no longer continue to lead the Singing for Pleasure group and a new Group Leader must be found for it to continue.

Singing is something that most of us enjoy. It can be nostalgic, recalling happy memories, or perhaps you just enjoy joining in when listening to a music track or the radio. However, belonging to a group can be more beneficial and is also a really good way to meet and socialise with people.

There are a variety of singing styles that can be experienced by joining a choir. Some people find this daunting and excuse themselves by saying that they can't sing well enough or can't read music. In fact, if you can talk, you can sing, maybe not with an operatic voice, but well enough to follow a tune. The ability to read music is not essential and most of the songs are from musicals and sung in unison.

What is generally not known is just how good singing in a choir can be for you. Not only does it improve the immune system significantly during practice sessions, but even more during a performance. It has also been found that it stimulates your emotional state by boosting your immune system as well as physical benefits, such as improved breathing and posture, and an increase in your concentration and self confidence.

The Singing for Pleasure group meets in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere and new members are always welcome so, if you would like to join us, why not come along? I will probably continue taking an active, if somewhat sedentary, part in the U3A but wish the Singing for Pleasure group success in the future under new leadership.
