

A comment was made recently stating that we ask too many questions of members on the annual Purbeck U3A subscription Renewal Form. All that we should be asking a renewing member is their name and whether a subscription to Third Age Matters and/or a U3A diary is required.

I don't know if that is a general view of members but it will simplify the renewal process if we don't use the forms to gain additional member information. But for one thing we could probably do away with an actual paper Renewal Form altogether. That one thing is the Gift Aid declaration that conventionally accompanies the Renewal Form.

Many of you have already completed a Gift Aid Form and you will have read our Treasurer's article in this Newsletter (see right) where he advises that Gift Aid is a valuable contribution to our finances. In fact we gain about £4.00 per annum for every subscription where a member has completed the Form.

However there are some 200 or so current members who have not and we would like to optimise the Gift Aid we receive from HMRC by ensuring that all tax paying members in agreement have completed the appropriate Gift Aid Form.

The Renewal Process this year and next will not ask for additional information other than if a member is a UK taxpayer - in which case encourage the completion of a Form if not already done. A Form only needs to be completed once. When we have this information we can probably do away with Renewal Forms altogether - simple!

From the Treasurer, Patrick Webb

A thank you to all who allow us to reclaim the tax on their subscription. Here is clarification of the rules for payments by a member and their spouse:

Gift Aid is a valuable contribution to Purbeck U3A finances and currently equates to a subsidy of £2.50 for every member. Any tax payer may complete a Gift Aid declaration to allow us to reclaim the tax paid.

In the case of a spouse paying the subscription for both parties, if they are both tax payers, the Gift Aid form should be signed by both parties or a separate form completed. If one party pays the subscription for both members and the spouse is a tax payer but has not completed a Gift Aid form, we can only reclaim the tax on the subscription for the party who has completed a Gift Aid form. Otherwise the payment for the spouse is considered as a Gift to the spouse, not the charity, and Gift Aid cannot be claimed.

Gift Aid forms may be found on our website or obtained from the Treasurer or Membership Secretary.

Did you know?...

Hire of a Car in the UK or Europe

From 8th June 2015 you will need a code from the DVLA as the paper version of the UK driving licence, which shows any penalty points, is being replaced with an online system. To obtain the code (which now lasts 21 days), you will need your National Insurance and Driving Licence numbers and to be able to access the DVLA website www.gov.uk/view-driving-licence

... or alternatively ring 0300 790 6801.

Car rental companies in the UK are legally required to check your full Driving Licence but this does vary in Europe. Remember this applies in both the UK and Europe so don't be caught out when you own car breaks down!

Current information includes:

- ► Subject Advisers are listed on the national website which is of interest to Group Leaders and those members planning to start a new group.
- ► The National Executive committee discussed paid tutors at their meeting in February this year. Guidelines are now being produced.
