Equally we loved his demonstrations of pitch on improvised instruments such as bottles, lengths of wood, rubber piping and straws. Then the audience was invited to have a go on these carefully tuned improvised instruments.

Nobody held back and after ten minutes spent practising, each group played "When the Saints Go Marching In". As each player was responsible for only one note this was not too difficult. The rest of us who did not manage to get our hands on an instrument were turned into an ad hoc backing group for a song about Uncle Joe's mint balls sung to the tune of "My Old Man's a Dustman".

Looking around, I was struck by how much fun everyone was having; the power of music to bring people together? Perhaps. The wonderfully laid back but informative duo of Dave and Di? Certainly.
